### **NOTICE OF RACE**

Notice is hereby given that the above sailing event is scheduled to take place at the Zululand Yacht Club from Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> October to Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> October 2008, both dates inclusive, and race entries are invited in terms of this Notice.

#### **ORGANISING AUTHORITY**

The regatta is organized by the Zululand Yacht Club under the authority and sanction of Sailing KZN.

#### **CLASSES**

Provincial Championship Classes: Optimist, Dabchick, Youth Laser, Youth Laser Radial and Youth Laser 4.7

Competitors in the Youth Laser Class may elect to amend their entry and change to another class should they prefer to compete in a class that has met the provincial championship requirements. Competitors electing to change class may do so at registration but before the close thereof on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> October at 10h30. Youth Laser competitors are reminded of the ILCA Class Rules Part Four rule 27(b) & 28(b) which allows the use of the Laser Radial and Laser 4.7 rig in the Laser and Laser Radial Classes respectively. ILCA Class Rules Part Four rule 27(d) and 28(d) will be applied where a competitor elects to use a Laser Radial rig in the Laser Class or a Laser 4.7 rig in the Laser or Laser Radial Class respectively.

#### **RULES**

The Regatta will be governed by the Rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) for 2005 - 2008 of the International Sailing Association Federation (ISAF) subject to any changes made in terms of this Notice.

The Championship requirements of Sailing KZN.

The Class Rules of all competing classes, subject to changes made in terms of this Notice.

This Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions and any amendments thereto.

Where relevant, precedence shall be in the reverse order of the above listing.

## **RULE CHANGES**

The RRS will be changed as follows, in terms of rule 86.

Rule 61.1(a) is changed so that the Optimist Class is not exempt from displaying a red protest flag.

## **ADVERTISING**

Category C will apply in terms of the ISAF advertising code RRS Appendix 1 Regulation 20.

## **ELIGIBILITY**

Competitors in the Championship classes shall comply with RRS Appendix 2 regulation 21, which requires that the helmsman and all other crew shall be members in good standing of a yacht club affiliated to and in good standing with South African Sailing (SAS). The name of the Yacht Club shall be stated on the Entry Form, and current valid club membership cards must be presented at Registration.

Competitors in the Optimist and Dabchick Classes shall conform to the age requirements of their respective Classes. Competitors in the Youth Laser Classes shall not have reached their 19<sup>th</sup> birthday before 31<sup>st</sup> December 2008.

## **MEASUREMENT CERTIFICATES**

Each competing yacht in the Championship Classes shall hold a valid class measurement or registration certificate issued or accepted by SAS, the number of which shall be stated on the entry form. A copy of the certificate shall be submitted with the entry form and the original thereof shall be available for inspection at Registration.

## **ENTRIES**

Entries shall be submitted on the Entry Form attached to this Notice of Race accompanied by the Entry Fee together with copies of the appropriate registration certificates, to reach the Regatta Secretary not later than close of business, Friday 19<sup>th</sup> September 2008 at the address below. Entries received thereafter will be subject to a fee surcharge of R25.00 and will be accepted until the close of registration and entries at the venue.

Entry forms must be countersigned by a parent or guardian if the competitor is under the age of 18 years on the first day of the regatta.

The Entry Fee is R250.00. Entries will be accepted until the close of registration at the venue.

### **SCRUTINY OF EQUIPMENT**

All yachts competing in the Provincial Class Championships shall, if requested, be made available for scrutiny by official Class measurers for compliance with the Class Rules.

### **REGISTRATION**

Entries shall be confirmed by registration with the regatta secretary at the main Clubhouse between 09h00 and 10h00 on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> October at which time entries will close.

### **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

Sailing Instructions will be available from the regatta secretary at registration.

### **PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIP REQUIREMENTS**

A minimum of **ten** valid entries received one hour before the scheduled starting time of the first race, at least ten finishers in any one race of the series and at least four races completed in a class will be required for the event in the class to qualify as a Provincial Championship.

### **SCHEDULE OF RACING**

The following races are scheduled on Olympic Triangle courses for the Dabchick and Youth Laser Classes and on a Trapezoid course for the Optimist Class in Richards Bay Harbour, launching from Zululand Yacht Club:

Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> October - The first race of the regatta (Start not before 10H30).

Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> October – Race day, first start not before 09H00

Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> October – Race day, first start not before 09H00.

The above Schedule is subject to change in terms of the sailing instructions. No race will be started after 13h30 on the last scheduled day of racing, unless racing is required in order to constitute a championship and, in the opinion of the race officer, such racing will be possible, in which case, the last race shall not start after 15h00.

A maximum of TWELVE races are scheduled.

### **SAFETY EQUIPMENT**

All competing yachts shall comply with their class buoyancy and safety requirements.

The wearing of a buoyancy aid capable of supporting a 5kg steel weight is compulsory at all times. Dry and Wet suits do not constitute buoyancy aids. Buoyancy aids of an inflatable type are prohibited.

The Optimist Class shall, in addition to IODA Class Rules 4.2(a) and (b), 4.3(a) and (b), have on board a secured paddle with a blade surface of not less than 0,025 square meters and each competitor shall carry an easily accessible whistle attached to his buoyancy aid.

### **SCORING**

The 'Low Points' scoring system RRS Appendix A4 will be used in all classes.

A minimum of FOUR races shall be completed.

If four races are completed, all race results will count.

If FIVE or more races are completed, ONE race result shall be discarded for every five races completed.

### **PRIZES, AWARDS & PRIZE GIVING**

Sailing KZN medals will be presented to competitors in accordance with the Sailing KZN requirements for Provincial Championships in accordance with the following table and subject to the classes qualifying for Provincial Championship status:

## **LIABILITY**

Participation in this event is entirely at the risk of competitors and no responsibility for damage or injury resulting there from will rest with the organising authority, class associations, or any persons concerned with the conduct of the regatta.

## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

Limited camping (maximum 60 persons) will be available at the Club for the weekend. Camp sites must be booked along with your registration, but will be taken on a first come, first served basis. Collection of payment for camping will be at registration.

Camping will be charged at R 150.00 per family for the weekend.

Catering facilities are available at ZYC for breakfasts, lunches and suppers. Cool drinks, sweets and snacks will be on sale. Bar facilities will be also available. A social bring & braai function is scheduled for Saturday evening. Rolls and salad will be provided. Fires will be lit ~18h00.

Prize giving will take place on Sunday 5th October 2008, as soon as practical after the last race in the ZYC Clubhouse.

### **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

#### **RULES**

The Regatta will be governed by the Rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) for 2005 - 2008 of the International Sailing Association Federation (ISAF) subject to any changes made in terms of this Notice.

The Championship requirements of Sailing KZN.

The Class Rules of all competing classes, subject to changes made in terms of the Notice of Race.

The Notice of Race and these Sailing Instructions and any amendments thereto.

Where relevant, precedence shall be in the reverse order of the above listing.

#### **NOTICES TO COMPETITORS**

Notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board, located in the Zululand Yacht Club clubhouse.

#### **CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 09h00 on the day that it will take effect, except that a change to the schedule of races will be posted by 18h30 on the day before it will take effect.

#### **SIGNALS MADE ASHORE**

Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flagstaff on the lawn, situated at the end of the point.

When the flag AP is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 30 minutes" in the RRS race signal AP.

## SCHEDULE OF RACES

Friday 3rd October - The first race of the regatta (Start not before 10H30).

Saturday 4th October – Race day, first start not before 09H00

Sunday 5th October – Race day, first start not before 09H00.

A maximum of TWELVE races are scheduled

The code flag “L” displayed on the committee boat at the end of a race shall indicate that the next race will be sailed soon after the last boat in the current race has finished. The next warning signal will be made one minute after the lowering of the “L” with one sound signal.

## CLASS FLAGS & STARTING ORDER

The following Class Flags and starting order shall apply.

### Optimist Trapezoid Course

1 <sup>st</sup> Start	Optimist Class	Optimist Class flag (Blue insignia on white background)
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### Dabchick Triangular Course

1 <sup>st</sup> Start	Dabchick Class	Code flag ‘D’
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### Youth Laser Triangular Course

1 <sup>st</sup> Start	Youth Laser Class	Laser Class flag (Red insignia on a white background)
2 <sup>nd</sup> Start	Youth Laser Radial Class	Laser Radial Class Flag (Red Laser insignia on green)
3 <sup>rd</sup> Start	Youth Laser 4.7 Class	Laser 4.7 Class Flag (Red Laser insignia on yellow)

## RACING AREA

The racing area within the Port of Richards Bay, shall be determined by the Principal Race Officer, but shall generally be off Pelican Island.

## THE COURSE

The Optimist course shall be the Trapezoidal Course without a leeward gate. Competitors shall sail around the marks in the following order, leaving all marks to port, S-1-2-3-F. See Appendix 1a.

The Dabchick course shall be the Triangular Course. Competitors shall sail around the marks in the following order, leaving all marks to port, S-1-2-3-1-3-1-2-3-F. See Appendix 1b.

The Youth Laser course for all Youth Laser Classes shall be the Triangular Course. Competitors shall sail around the marks in the following order, leaving all marks to port, S-1-2-3-1-3-1-2-3-F. See Appendix 1c.



The Race Committee will endeavour to lay a course that should take competitors approximately 40 to 50 minutes to complete.

## **MARKS**

The marks of the course shall be red or yellow cylindrical buoys.

## **THE START**

Races will be started using RRS 26 with the warning signal given 5 minutes before the starting signal. The warning signal for each succeeding class will be made with the starting signal of the preceding class.

The starting line shall be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat at the Starboard end and the start mark on the Port end.

Yachts whose warning signal has not been made shall keep clear of the starting area and of all yachts whose warning signal has been made.

A yacht starting later than 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored **Did Not Compete**. This changes rule A4.1.

## **THE FINISH**

The finishing line shall be between the staff displaying an orange flag on the Committee boat at the Starboard end and the Finish Mark at the Port end. Unless a yacht is starting or finishing, it is not necessary to sail through the start/finish line.

The Race Committee may shorten the course at a mark by displaying the code flag S and the appropriate Class Flag(s), with two sound signals before the leading yacht of the class concerned has reached that mark. Yachts of that class (those classes) shall then finish at the prescribed Finish Line.

The Optimist Course will not be shortened.

## **TIME LIMIT**

Yachts failing to finish within twenty minutes of the first yacht in her class shall be scored **Did Not Finish**. This changes rule 35 and A4.1.

## **PROTESTS**

Protests shall be written on forms available at the race office and delivered there before the protest time limit.

The “**Protest Time limit**” is one hour after the last yacht has finished the last race of the day.

Protests wherever possible, will be heard promptly and in the order of receipt. Protest notices will be posted on the official Notice Board as soon as possible after the end of the protest time limit, to inform competitors of the time of the protest hearing(s).

On the last day of the regatta, a request for the reopening of a hearing shall be delivered, within the protest time limit if the party requesting reopening was informed of the decision on the previous day, or no later than 30 minutes after the party requesting reopening was informed of the decision on that day. This changes rule 66.

## **SCORING**

The 'Low Points' scoring system RRS Appendix A4 will be used in all classes.

A minimum of FOUR races shall be completed.

If four races are completed, all race results will count.

If more than FIVE races are completed, ONE race result shall be discarded for every five races

***Points will be awarded at the KZN Youth Laser Class Provincial Championships to competing helmsman in accordance with the LASA accepted procedure for positioning on the 2008/2009 National Ranking Ladder which may then be used for selection purposes.***

## **REPLACEMENT OF CREW**

Substitution of the skipper after the first race is prohibited.

Substitution of a crew member will not be allowed without the prior written approval of the Race Committee.

## **PRIZES**

Prize Giving will be held on Sunday 5th October as soon as practical after the last race.

Sailing KZN Provincial Championship Medals will be awarded to the skipper and crew subject to the following requirements:-

10 finishers in any one race : Gold & Silver medals

11 or more finishers in any one race : Gold Silver and Bronze medals

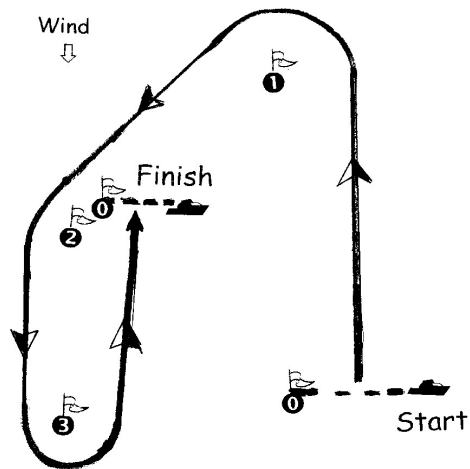

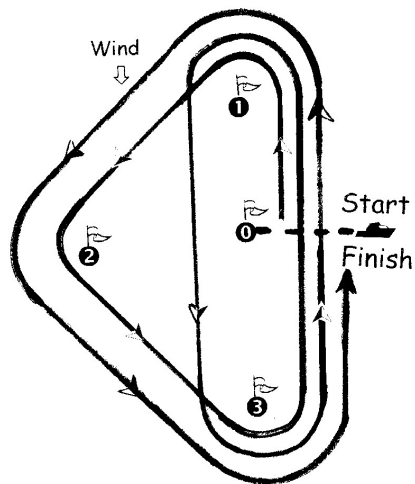

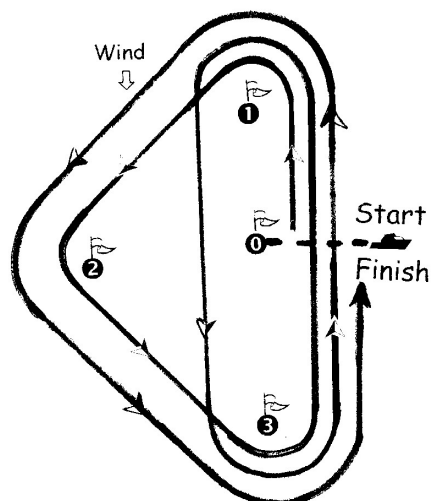
### Appendix 1a : Optimist Trapezoid Course S-1-2-3-F
